What to do if you've lost your home:

- 1.) If you are experiencing an emergency, please call 911.
- 2.) Call 704-284-9665 for a coordinated entry assessment.
 - a. What Coordinated Assessment IS:
 - A process that assesses persons who are presently homeless or will be homeless within 72 hours, for referral to a housing resource in the County that fits their need and situation.
 - A network of designated locations with staff that are trained to evaluate the person's qualifications to enter the Coordinated Assessment process and to be referred to available housing options.
 - Provide: name, last four of social, birthdate and they will ask a few other questions.
 - A Proactive referral, *if space is available*. If space, is not available they may be put on a waiting list.
 - Domestic violence will be referred directly to domestic violence shelter

b. What Coordinated Assessment IS NOT:

- A program
- A guarantee of housing space
- An applications completion service
- A housing clearinghouse.

*At this time, Coordinated Assessments will not be available Wednesdays 12-2

After assessment hours, homeless individuals and families should be directed to an emergency shelter:

- Single Women and Families: Salvation Army Center of Hope
- People Seeking Domestic Violence Services or in imminent danger: Safe Alliance

5.) Housing Programs

- a. Charlotte Family Housing | 300 Hawthorne Ln, Charlotte, NC | (704) 335-5488
 - Applicant must be family unit (one adult and one dependent). Total household income must be less than 80% of AMI (verified by any income received). Applicant must be a Mecklenburg County resident for at least 30 days. Applicant must be free from active substance abuse for at least three months outside of any residential treatment programs. Applicant will be given a criminal background check at time of assessment. Applicants with convicted sex offenses, felonies within the last three years and/or with pending charges are not eligible. Applicant demonstrates motivation to make changes in their lives and is open to partnering closely with a social worker to do so. Applicants must be

willing to provide proof of income earned and money saved while in the program.

- b. Gracious Hands | 3131 Oneida Rd, Charlotte, NC | (704) 962-6147
 - i. Currently accepting applications
 - ii. Women only, must have child(ren) with them
 - iii. \$50/week. \$200 entry.
 - iv. Do not have to have a job when entering but must get one within two weeks.
 - v. Must attend courses on finances, life skills
 - vi. 12-month residency cap
- c. The Harvest Center | 5415 Airport Dr, Charlotte, NC | (704) 335-1616
 - i. 12-18-month transitional housing program
 - ii. Housing candidates must be willing to work 30 hours/week. Job not required for program entry but soon after.
 - iii. Self-referral. Call number listed above. (9am-4pm)
- d. Hope House | 15604 Northcross Dr, Huntersville, NC | (704) 992-1902
 - i. Women only, with or without children
 - ii. No boys over 8
 - iii. 6-month transitional housing
- e. Catherine's House | 141 Mercy Drive, Belmont, NC | (704) 852-9599
 - i. No boys over 10
 - ii. 4-month transitional housing
 - iii. Call to request initial phone screening

6.) School & Homelessness

- **a.** The Education for Homeless Children and Youths (EHCY) program ensures that homeless children and youths have equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including a public preschool education, as provided to other children and youth.
- **b.** When enrolling in school, you may select:
 - i. The school of origin, which is "the school that a child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled, including a preschool", or
 - **ii.** The school that non-homeless students who live in the attendance area are eligible to attend
